Beaches

	Second draft 2021 compared to 2015 Policy
Seven Mile Beach	<p>Esplanade to Area 2 (CCC) is off-lead outside summer restrictions</p> <p>Area 2 to 3 changed from off-lead year round to off-lead with summer restrictions</p> <p>Parks and Wildlife Service areas: Area 3 to Area 4 (PWS) was on-lead outside summer restrictions. Area 4 to 1 km from Sandy Point – PWS, was on-lead. 1 km either side of Sandy Point is prohibited (PWS)</p>

Multi-User Pathways

On-lead on trails, and for 2 metres either side:

Tangara trail (250 km)	Was off-lead in 2015, now on-lead 'due to increase use by cyclists and pedestrians'
Mortimer Bay Coastal Track	Was off-lead in 2015 (except south), now on-lead
Lauderdale Wetlands Track	Was off-lead, now prohibited

Regional Parks

Depending on the use and facilities provided in the park dogs may be restricted, on lead or effective control provisions will apply. CHANGES SHOULD NOT TAKE PLACE **UNTIL PARKS ARE DEVELOPED**

Roscommon Reserve Lauderdale	Now on-lead only (and on-track only in wetland reserve area)
Richmond Riverbanks	Must be on-lead on both sides of river, and above and below the bridge
Cambridge, Cambridge Road – fenced dog park to be developed	Cambridge Dog Park off-lead, to be developed behind the soccer grounds
17 Goodwins Rd, Clarendon Vale	Greyhound area to be developed
Lauderdale, Lauderdale Saltmarsh reserve – fenced dog park to be developed	An area within the redeveloped tip site land is to be developed as dog off-lead
Natone Street Lindisfarne – fenced dog park to be developed	Proposed to be developed as alternative to Anzac Park going on-lead. Area adjacent to the turning circle in Natone Street behind Bowls Club (to be developed). May not proceed with Anzac Park remaining off-lead.
Rosny, 3/22 Rosny Hill Road, the site of the Rosny Golf Course	Proposed area. Could become an on-lead area if it ceases to be a golf course, <u>pending</u> future development of this area. Removed in current draft.

Natone Hill	Now on-lead and on track, previously off-lead
Bedlam Walls Bushland Reserve	Now on-lead and on track, previously off-lead
Waverley Flora Park	Now on-lead and on track, previously off-lead
Mortimer Bay Coastal Reserve	Was off-lead 2015 except for southern end (prohibited). Not mentioned in 2021 – is it now all PWS?
Wiena Bushland Reserve	Now on-lead and on track, previously off-lead
North Warrane Bushland Reserve	Now on-lead and on track, previously off-lead
Glebe Hill Bushland Reserve	Now on-lead and on track, previously off-lead
Pilchers Hill Bushland Reserve	Now on-lead and on track, previously off-lead
Otago Bay Lagoon Reserve	Now on-lead and on track, previously off-lead
Potters Hill Bushland Reserve	Now on-lead and on track, previously off-lead
Lauderdale Wetland Reserve	Now on-lead and on track, previously off-lead
Nowra Bushland Reserve	Now on-lead and on track, previously off-lead
Rokeby Hills Bushland Reserve	Now on-lead and on track, previously off-lead
Toorittya Bushland Reserve	Now on-lead and on track, previously off-lead
Kuynah Bushland Reserve	Now on-lead and on track, previously off-lead
Bandicoot Bushland Park	Now on-lead and on track, previously off-lead
Tranmere Foreshore Reserve (Tranmere Point)	Now part of Foreshore Trail and on lead. Previously was off-lead
Pipe Clay Lagoon 91-201 Cremorne Rd near Clifton Beach	This part of the lagoon was previously PWS and off-lead outside summer restrictions. Now prohibited year-round.
